Report on the SARCCM Advisory Committee Meeting held at OUC 19 September 2011

The second Sino-Australian Research Centre for Coastal Management (SARCCM) Advisory Committee meeting was held at Ocean University of China (OUC) on 19 September 2011. SARCCM is a joint research centre established by OUC and the University of New South Wales (UNSW). Among those present at the meeting were Prof. Michael Frater (the Rector of UNSW Canberra), Prof. Joseph Lai (Associate Dean (Research), UNSW Canberra), Prof. Dexing Wu (the President of OUC and Chair of the SARCCM Advisory Committee) and Mr Junji Song (the Director General of Shandong Peninsula Blue Economic Zone Office and SARCCM Advisory Committee member representing public sectors in China).

Prof. Dexing Wu, in his speech, indicated that unsustainable development and utilization of coastal resources spur the scientific research on the coastal zone in many countries. These countries are exploring the patterns and approaches of integrated coastal zone management. SARCCM aims to strengthen the research on theory and practice of coastal zone management, improve the sustainable development of marine economics and societies, as well as deepen the international cooperation in these fields. OUC will continue to regard SARCCM as a significant platform for international collaboration and provide strong support for its research activities.

At the meeting, A/Prof. Xiao Hua Wang, the Director of SARCCM (Australia), made a [SARCCM mid-term report](#) and delivered a speech entitled 'Marina Development in China and Australia'. Director General Junji Song introduced the planning, establishment and development of Shandong Peninsula Blue Economic Zone in terms of its objectives and priorities, as well as this year's focus. Mr Linji Song, the Deputy Secretary General of Weihai City and Adjunct Professor of OUC and Shandong University at Weihai gave a speech titled 'Creating a Weihai City Blue Economic Zone'. The Advisory Committee meeting was presided by Prof. Xiangmin Xu, the Director of SARCCM (China) and Head of the School of Law and Political Science at OUC. The meeting was concluded by a remark from Prof. Michael Frater who pledged UNSW Canberra support for the Centre and discussed possible funding sources for the Centre.
